

Shirt colour is such an important part of a club's identity that fans often use it as a nickname for the team. Design your own club kit and give them a nickname.








CREATE YOUR OWN TEAM MASCOT





We already know that it would be quite difficult to play football on Mars. It would be cold, dark and difficult to control the ball. Players would also need to wear oxygen masks!

- Jupiter has no solid surface so footballers would need to learn to run on liquid
- Neptune is furthest from Earth and footballs would fly away as it is very windy
- Saturn is the sixth planet from the sun

















Did You Know? The recently discovered galaxy Cosmos Redshift 7 was named after Cristiano Ronaldo



Stadiums are buildings where football matches take place in front of spectators. They are often enormous, towering structures that dominate the skyline of their cities. Design your own football stadium for your team.







The human body contains 206 bones, including 54 in the hands and 52 in the feet. These bones are some of the ones that footballers fracture or injure most often. Can you identify them?






Match the famous Landmark to the city that has hosted a World Cup final.
